This week we came to the MASH!

On Wednesday

- We observed a strat discussion thank you to Lauren, Aly, Rachel, Colette and Rebecca for letting us listen to you in action
- We behaved like an enquiry moving through the MASH by speaking to people
 who would be processing the enquiry and making decisions about it. We
 spoke to Ana (MASHO), Laura (SW), Debbie (TM), Tracey (EHUO).
- We took some photos and did some drawings
- We supported the Diamond Team to be ready for the Show and Tell

On Thursday

With 26 practitioners from across the MASH, Partners, Early Help, the Assessment Team and referrers, we co-designed two ways that we can start trying to change things. The two tests are experimenting with:

Test 1 - WHO is at the front door

Creating a duty team made up of MASHO, AP, Police, Health, Education and EHO who will triage calls and online forms that come in on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday over the next 2 weeks.

Test 2 - HOW the referral gets in

Carefully selecting a group of referrers to test out just using a phone line to discuss why the referrer has called. A frontdoor professional makes a professional judgement of the needs and risks of the child during this discussion and communicates next steps or outcomes back to the referrer. The referrer is able to receive advice, support and next steps at the point of contact.
